There are different types of family structures, including the nuclear family above. Despite the changing lifestyles and ever-increasing personal mobility that characterize modern society, the family remains the central element of contemporary life. The authoritative parenting style is characterized by high expectations of children, but unlike the authoritarian style, these parents provide a great deal of support and guidance for their children. Authoritative parents set rules, but they also explain these rules and set clear and fair expectations.

4 Types of Parenting Styles and Their Effects on Kids

It's important to ensure your parenting style is supporting healthy growth and development because the way you interact with your child and how you discipline her will influence her for the rest of her life. Researchers have identified four types of parenting styles: 1. Authoritarian.

Parenting Styles: How Each Style Impacts Children ...

Authoritative: This is generally considered the most comprehensive style of parenting: Parents are highly sensitive and supportive of kids, while also providing boundaries, structure, clear expectations, and autonomy. Uninvolved: Parents here usually don't have expectations for their children—nor do they provide structure or support. Children raised this way may struggle with developing ...

These four parenting styles are based on two parental dimensions: parental warmth, which is related to parental affection toward and acceptance of the child, and parental control, which is

related to the active role parents play in promoting respect for rules and social conventions (Maccoby and Martin, 1983).

If your parenting styles are vastly different, this may be an area of conflict. Some parents are relaxed about discipline, preferring to simply talk to children about mistakes. Other parents are extremely strict and believe that handing out specific punishments is the way to keep a home on track.

TYPES OF PARENTING — THE STRUCTURE OF THE FAMILY

Adolescents provided information on parental and sibling status and completed a seventeen-item instrument measuring the general parenting style dimensions of involvement and strictness, from which four styles were derived: indulgent, neglectful, authoritarian, authoritative.

The parenting styles outlined by Baumrind include the «Authoritarian» style, the «Authoritative» style, and the «Permissive» style. After further research was carried out on this topic, a fourth style was added to this list by psychologists John Martin and Eleanor Maccoby. This style was known as «Uninvolved» or «Neglectful» parenting.

It looks at parenting styles and children's outcome, ethnic groups and parenting styles, family structure and parenting styles, and parenting styles and academic performance. However, the findings suggest inconsistencies regarding the effects of parenting styles on children's academic performance.
